Stonefield Neighborhood Association Minutes of Annual Meeting

March 18, 2013

Officers and Volunteers Present: Norm Arendt (President), David Diercks (Treasurer), Ralph Swoboda (Secretary), Jim Dvorsky (Director), Mike Adler (Director), Robin Sweet (Welcome Committee), Jeff Mattox (Webmaster).

- **1. Call to Order.** Norm Arendt called the meeting at the Middleton Sport Bowl to order at 7:10 pm and introduced the Association volunteers and guests.
- **2. Election of Officers and Directors.** There being no other nominees, the current officers and directors were re-elected for another one-year term:

- **3. Budget.** David Diercks distributed a financial report showing the current checkbook balance of \$9,425. He also presented a budget of \$7,010 in revenue and \$3,870 in expenses for the coming financial year, reflecting the semi-annual receipt of dues and publication of the Stonefield directory. The members voted to approve the 2013-2014 budget as presented.
- **4. Mayor's Report.** Mayor Kurt Sonnentag presented a summary of his "State of the City" report, which he will be presenting to the Council. An open-house at the Fire Station on April 9 will celebrate Middleton's 50th Anniversary as a city.
- **5. Neighborhood Crime.** Officer Jesse Selleck reported that leads have deadended in the search for those responsible for the home break-ins Stonefield has suffered in recent months. However, some of the items stolen have been recovered, and arrests for possession of stolen property are imminent.
- **6. School Construction.** Perry Hibner reported that favorable bond financing has been secured for the building project approved by the voters in November. Construction of the new Kromrey Middle School will commence this summer.
- **7. City Counsel Members.** Alderpersons JoAnna Richard and Gurdip Brar offered brief comments on various matters affecting the neighborhood. It was reported that the city will be planting eight trees along Old Middleton Road between Stonefield Road and Cypress Trail, to restore a tree line that used to be

there.
